## Matching and Weighting

YouGov interviewed 1359 respondents who were then matched down to a sample of 1200 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched on gender, age, race, education, party identification, ideology and political interest. YouGov then weighted the matched set of survey respondents to known characteristics of the registered voters in Texas from the 2010 Current Population survey and the 2007 Pew Religious Life Survey using propensity score weights.
